


### PAC Survey: Virtual Learning Update

- 3. Overall Satisfied with Virtual Learning








## ...or maybe, to yearbook or NOT to yearbook?




- We've already sold five books

- It would take a good deal of buyin from parents, staff, and a team of creative yearbook collaborators to create content.
- Staff members and parents (including myself) are spread thin right now.





## A MODEST PROPOSAL

I propose we create a survey to gauge interest in both purchasing, and actively participating in, the yearbook this year.

If there isn't resounding interest in buying a yearbook, or helping to create a yearbook, this year. We'll have our answer.

In order to pursue creating a yearbook this year, it will require help in the following areas:

- A plan to acquire portraits of each student, whether by zoom class screen captures, in-person photography, or parental involvement. (This will probably be the most difficult part to assemble.)
- Parental and staff buy-in to provide photos of their students. (This has been difficult in past years, even with many, many in-person photoworthy occasions, field-trips, and performances.)
- A dedicated creative time to create imaginative content, and assist with writing and layouts (ie: what do students' home desks look like? How can we show the community support this year? Driveby activities? Mask Fashion? Can we do a Flat Stanley concept with the HH tiger?)
